What is a house leader?

House leaders are students in our community who are actively invested in all components of Lightbearers and are inspiring their roommates and the community to do the same. A house leader's most impactful form of leadership is one of example – a **front-runner** in our community. A common saying at Lightbearers is: 'As the house leader goes, so the house goes.' As house leaders invest in their mentor relationship, for example, their roommates are often spurred on to do the same. Secondly, a house leader is a **facilitator** – this includes leading house time and assessing the needs of his/her house. A good facilitator may invest in his/her peers by choosing house time curriculum and asking good questions. Lastly, a house leader is a **friend**. This is a peer-to-peer discipleship relationship - house leaders pursue their roommates by striving to develop a personal friendship. As house leaders are front-runners, facilitators and friends in this community, we trust the Lord to provide growth.

General Expectations

- Standard Lightbearers engagement – house leaders set an example of investment into this community and all
- components of discipleship (4-6 hours/week – this includes house time)

 - Missions
 - Community
- Real-life experience in leadership with individualized coaching and feedback from staff
- House leader retreat twice a year and monthly house leader meetings
- Weekly house meetings that the house leader facilitates
- Active participation in Lightbearers events
